Molly Andrews is Honorary Professor of Political Psychology at the Social Research Institute, University College London, and the co-director of the Association of Narrative Research and Practice. She currently holds a Leverhulme Emeritus Fellowship for her project “A multidisciplinary exploration of personal narratives and scholarship.” She has been a Writing Fellow at the Johannesburg Institute for Advanced Studies (2022), and in 2019-2020, she was the Jane and Aatos Professor in Studies on Contemporary Society at the Helsinki Collegium for Advanced Studies. Her books include *Lifetimes of Commitment: Aging, Politics, Psychology and Shaping History: Narratives of Political Change* (both Cambridge University Press), and *Narrative Imagination and Everyday Life* (Oxford University Press). She serves on the Editorial Board of six journals
